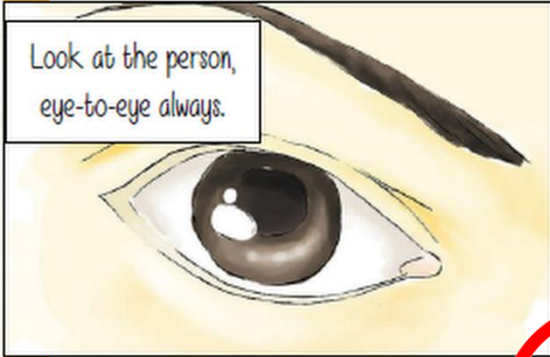

Words and Greetings to learn and know.

"Hi, how are you?" or "hello, how are you?"

"My name's Billy (use your own name of course). This is informal so 'Billy' is sufficient.

FIRST: Tell the person who you are yourself briefly.

SECOND: Ask about the person's interests.

EXAMPLE

"I am with ABC Company" "I'm a singer/sales engineer/tour guide"

"This meeting is great, I really like it"

"What about you" ... "Where are you from?"

"How did you like the meeting?"
